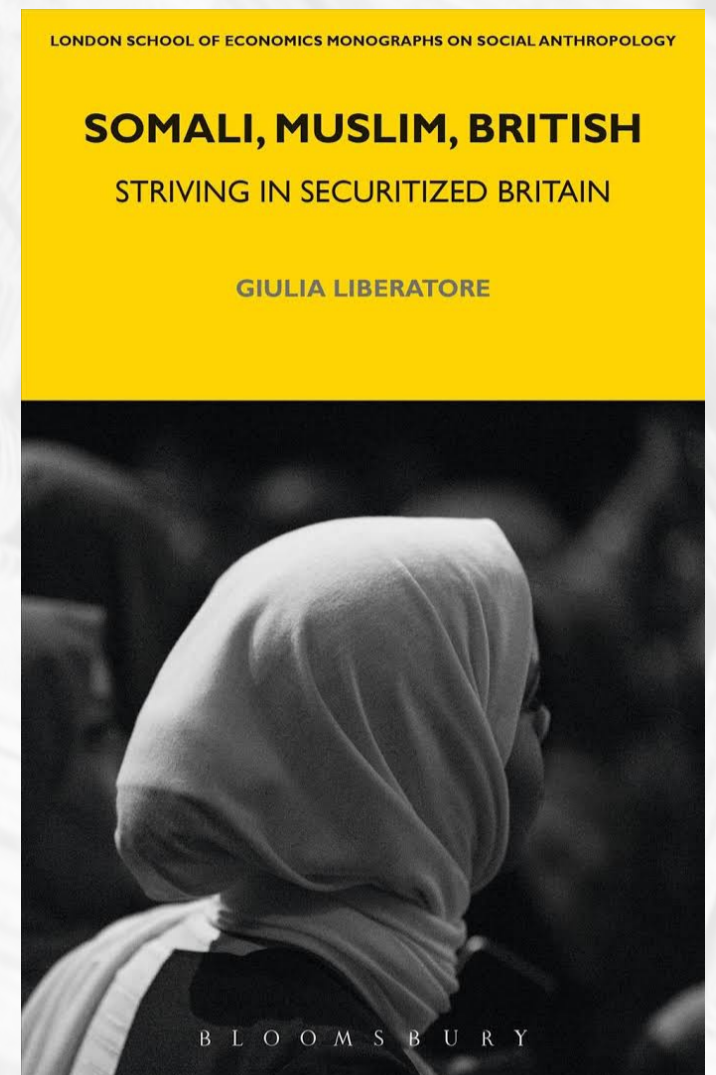

**Giulia Liberatore** is a Leverhume Early Career Fellow currently working on a project on female Islamic scholarship and guidance in the UK at the Alwaleed Centre, and in the Sociology department, University of Edinburgh. She will commence a Lectureship in Muslims in Europe in September 2018.

Giulia has a PhD in Anthropology from the London School of Economics (LSE). Between 2014-16 she worked at the Centre on Migration, Policy and Society (COMPAS), University of Oxford, first as a Research Officer on the Diaspora Engagement in War-Torn Societies project, as part of the Oxford Diasporas Programme (2014), and subsequently as a Leverhulme Fellow (2015-16).
